Pupil premium outcomes for 2016-7

Allocation

Pupil Premium was spent according to the allocations within the 2016-7 Strategy document except where at KS3 the external company identified for maths intervention were unable to provide the intervention to cost and expenditure was redirected into KS4 after school subject revision classes for subjects across the school.

Effects

Literacy – Use of Reading Wise showed increased progress in reading ages for targeted groups

KS4

- Pupils with 5+ A*-C (inc E + M) Pupil premium outcomes improved by 4% but in school gap widened
- Pupils with 5+ A*-D (inc E + M) In school gap closed by 1%
- In school progress 8 gap closed: -0.21 for disadvantaged as for non-disadvantaged
- Pupil premium students made similar good progress to last year in English and improved progress from last year in Maths.
- The percentage of Pupil Premium students achieving A-A* increased in English and Maths
- Pupil premium students Value Added of 1004.49 was +11.06 in school gap

KS5

- Pupil Premium student recruitment to Sixth Form is good with numbers yet to be finalised

Attendance

Pupil premium student attendance in Y7 was in line with non-pupil premium and in Y11 pupil premium student attendance was better than non-pupil premium, however, in other years the gaps are still to be closed with Y10 pupil premium persistent absentees a focus.
